

FINAL RECITALS

Students and teachers are busy preparing for recital performances. We invite you to attend. Encourage these young musicians as they show us the progress made this season. These recitals performances also serve as an audition for students recommended by their private teacher to apply for a Year 2 or Year 3 scholarship. Additional Scholarship applications ask students to tell us the impact their year of lessons has made. Here is what John, a high school sophomore told us:

Here is what John, a high school sophomore told us: "I believe if you find something that you're good at and love it, that you should continue to strive to be the best you can be and be thankful for the opportunities... Outside of playing the saxophone, I enjoy the theater program and cross country. It's fun and challenging to balance all of them but I believe it's worth it because I am able to do all the things I love. I have been able to do all of this while maintaining good attendance and a 3.5 cumulative grade point average. I believe the program has taught me commitment and determination. I am thankful for the opportunities and love knowing that playing the saxophone is an option for a future career."

And from a sixth grader we heard, "... my attitude toward music has to be patient, because I'm very patient while I'm practicing my instrument... I have this dedication towards music because I want to/believe I can excel at it. Looking at my grades I do believe they improved because of the concentration I have learned while practicing. Playing my instrument has taught me how to focus more on everyday things and not only while practicing and because of that I believe it had a huge impact on my grades."

Recently, CIVIC MUSIC hosted another Musician Meet-Up for the students of the Private Lesson Program. Students and their families join us for dinner and conversation. After dinner, we have a musical activity for the students. At the November Meet-Up, Carmen Kitts led us in a rhythm activity. In April, Gary Huber led us in a drum circle.


